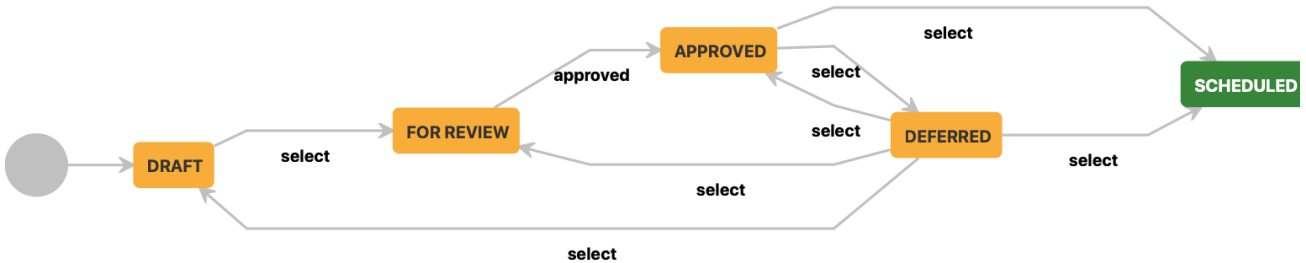


# Product Requirements blueprint workflow

## Overview

The [Confluence Product Requirements Blueprint](#) can only have one workflow attached - the **Requirements workflow**.



Once a Space administrator [attaches the workflow to this Blueprint](#)

- each time the page is edited it requires approval from one of the stakeholders
- when all stakeholders have approved the content, the document automatically moves into a new state

For example, instead of manually updating the **Document status** field when content is updated on the Product Requirements Blueprint content, the workflow updates the field automatically.

On creating the content, the attached workflow will require you to define the users in the template page properties, **Developers** and **QA**

- these users are referenced by the workflow using the value references `@DeveLopers@` and `@QA@`

These values will need to be defined for each page.

## Attaching the Product Requirements workflow

In the space tools **Templates dashboard**

- choose **Attach workflow** for the **Product Requirements Blueprint**
- choose **Attach** in the dialog box to confirm

### Attach Workflow

Use the workflow to manage the different states of your Requirements

- **Requirements Status**  
From *Draft* to *Scheduled*
- **Stakeholders**

Approvals for the requirements stakeholders are generated

In the space tools Document Management dashboard the **Requirements Blueprint workflow** is added as an active space scope workflow.

## Using the Product Requirements Blueprint

Once the Requirements Blueprint workflow is attached

- choose the ellipsis menu to **Create from template ...**
- select the **Product Requirements Blueprint**

- Jira report**  
Communicate Jira information in easy to read reports.
- Product requirements**  
Define, track and scope requirements for your product or feature.
- Retrospective**  
What went well? What could have gone better? Crowdsource improvements with your team.
- Strategy Board**  
Brainstorm, visualize and build your content
- Meeting notes**  
Plan your meetings and share notes and actions with your team.
- Project poster**  
Understand what problem you're solving and why you're solving it.
- Share a link**  
Share and discuss content from the web like articles and videos with your team.
- Task report**  
Keep track of tasks for your team or project.

### Let's get started

#### With product requirements you can...

- 1 Define document properties**  
Add properties like status and owner to your document to make it easy to organise and sort your product requirements.
- 2 Create requirements**  
The customisable template brings structure and consistency to your product requirements. If you use Jira you can create stories right from the requirements page.
- 3 Track progress**  
See the status of all your requirements at a glance. Sort by properties like status and release, or access linked Jira issues from your requirements pages.

On the document, the **Requirements Blueprint workflow** is applied.

If you have not added the values for the **Developer** and **QA** page properties an on-screen message will be displayed.

 You need *Developers* and *QA* users before submitting for review

Until you add values for both of these page properties, the **Draft** state transition will not be available.
